Rector's Letter to the 4th Day CURSILLO #164

"So now I am giving you a new commandment. Love each other. Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples." John 13:34-35



DeColores, my dear brothers and sisters of the Fourth Day!

It is a tremendous blessing to have been chosen to be lay rector for Cursillo #164! I am certain that the Lord has been preparing me for this purpose for quite some time and I am overjoyed to know that this is the plan He has for me! (Jeremiah 29:11). I am also thrilled with the team that will be serving alongside me and I believe with all my heart that they have been specifically chosen.

Last fall, just before Thanksgiving 2010 I began to simply pray, "Lord, please pick my team" and then just thanked Him daily for it. I was soon filled with an overwhelming peace, confident that He would answer me. On November 28, I received an e-mail devotional, one I had received weekly for years. As I scrolled down to read, suddenly appeared something I had never seen in all those years; one line highlighted in yellow. The line stated, "Are you ready? It takes a team of one, filled with humility and commitment to Me, to the call and to the team. Open your heart. Support all. Listen to me." I sat in amazement, feeling that the Lord was speaking directly to me! The very next day, names began to come to my mind and I began to have uncanny encounters with those very same people. The Lord truly was picking my team!

The classic Christian writer Oswald Chambers states, "All of God's people are ordinary people who have been made extraordinary by the purpose He has given them." This is an extraordinary team, being even now empowered by the Holy Spirit to be "living stones" (1 Peter 2:4-5) in order to build up the kingdom of God at Cursillo 164.

The beloved disciple John is the saint I have chosen. I came to know him quite well during a thirty-two week study of his Gospel the year before my election as rector. I now know this was in preparation for my weekend.

John was with Jesus Christ from the beginning of His ministry. He was the only disciple who did not run but stayed at the foot of the cross during the crucifixion. He and Peter were the first disciples to run to the tomb to witness the resurrection. John is the only disciple who lived a long life and died a natural death. John had more to say about LOVE (my word for the weekend) than any of the other gospel writers. It is John who recorded, not once, but numerous times throughout his gospel and letters our Lord's words that we should "love one another."

I believe that this is a clear message to us as Christian leaders in the Fourth Day community. Our Lord did not "suggest" that His disciples love one another; He commanded it.

I read recently that "discipleship is tested not by the creed we recite, not by the hymns we sing, not by the rituals we observe, but by the fact that we "love one another." "This is the measure by which the world will believe in us or our Christ. It is the final test of discipleship."

I want to thank all of you for your love, your prayers, your palanca, and your support to make this weekend possible. It is my prayer that the participants of Cursillo #164 will experience Christ in such a way that their lives and the lives of others will be transformed by the power of His unconditional love.

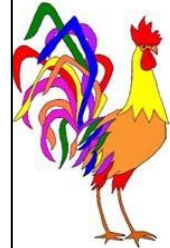
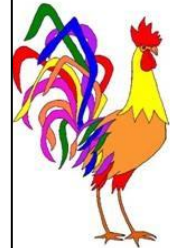
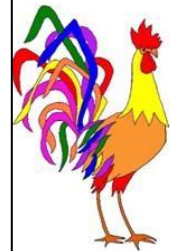

DIRECTIONS TO ST. MICHAEL'S 71 Broad Street, Charleston, SC 29401-2902

Word to the wise: *Parking may be a premium so plan to arrive early. Parking on the street is prohibitive unless you have the appropriate sticker. Parking is available in nearby parking garages.*

From I-26

Take I-26 toward Charleston, Take exit 221B on the left for Meeting Street toward the Visitor Center. Turn right onto Meeting Street/US-52. Turn left onto Broad Street (just past Court House Square).

From Hwy 17 North

Follow 17 N to Lockwood Drive exit toward Visitor Center, keep right at the fork and merge onto Lockwood Drive. Lockwood Drive becomes Broad Street.

From Hwy 17 South

Follow US-17 S. Take the Morrison Drive ramp to E Bay Street. Turn left on Morrison Drive / US-52 SPUR. Continue to follow US-52 SPUR which becomes E Bay Street. Turn right on Broad Street, Broad Street is just past Gillon Street.

FROM THE DIOCESAN LAY COORDINATOR

Brothers and Sisters,

Change is everywhere. Change is constant. We cannot stop it, and usually we do not like it. We have been evolving for millennia as God reveals Himself to us as the human race. Without too much effort, I can think of a few things that do NOT change...God's Love for Us and the Enemy's desire to divert us from that love. The Enemy's most effective method is 'lack of action.'

As an old sailor, I refer to that as the Doldrums, an area of the Atlantic, Pacific and Indian Oceans where the weather is either dead calm or highly volatile. Modern meteorologists call it the Inter-tropical Convergence Zone, and the local weather gurus call it the Birthplace of Hurricanes. The effect is the same. When we are in the Doldrums, we are either lethargic to the point of comatose or moving, growing, changing into something energetic and given a new name to designate us a something special, something to be remembered. Our Lord encourages us to come out of the Doldrums, the place where the Enemy has control, and has given us a new name, a new direction, a new vitality, a new purpose. New implies change, which is what we must do.

Our challenge is to make the Cursillo Experience more than the weekend. We need to make it the Fourth Day, and we need to make that Fourth Day a place where the Spirit of God is visible and active. We need to make the Cursillo Movement meaningful for the new generation, just as it was for us when we arrived at Camp St. Christopher. Let us work together, all 5000 plus of us, to change the face of Cursillo in this Diocese and the Lowcountry.
